■ Swedex moves to Gothenburg

On 1 April 2010, Folkuniversitetet in Gothenburg takes over the Swedex administrative work that was previously handled by Landesverband der Volkshochschulen Niedersachens in Germany. This change is intended to strengthen the Swedex organization and its ties with Sweden. The Swedex office at Landesverband der Volkshochschulen Niedersachens will become a regional office, responsible for some of our relations with test centres and examiners in the German-speaking countries.
